#### **SEEDS**


SEEDS is a STEM based after-school program designed for public school students with a high economic need starting with the age group of 9-12. Currently, we have impacted 100 students from five (5) municipalities: Guaynabo, Barranquitas, Vieques, Aibonito, and Toa Baja. Our curriculum teaches youth from public schools how to run a business using coffee as their learning tool. SEEDS allows students to tackle real-world business problems, learn financial literacy, engage in a mentorship program with industry and business leaders.

Youth entrepreneurship provides a path forward out of poverty, and to self-sufficiency not only for the youth themselves, but also for their families and communities. Developing the skills necessary for entrepreneurship allows youth not only to launch their small businesses, but also to learn financial intelligence and soft skills needed to enter the workforce successfully.


















### **SEEDS** Businesses
